Girls State Rules

1.	Upon her arrival at Girls State, no citizen shall be permitted to leave the campus of Northwest
	Nazarene University except as follows:
	☐ On organized group trips under the leadership of Girls State Staff.
	\Box In case of emergency.
	☐ Upon State Business and then only with a written permit signed by the Director and the Citizen's counselor.

- 2. No citizens are permitted outside their dorm after the City Meetings. In case of an emergency, she shall notify her counselor immediately.
- 3. As a guest of the University, citizens shall observe all campus and equipment rules, and respect university property.
- 4. Each citizen is responsible for the neatness of her room and shall have it ready for inspection each morning. Evidence of her occupancy shall be disposed of before vacating her room on the final day of the session.
- 5. Every citizen is expected to attend all sessions, all committee meetings and all ceremonies of the ALA Idaho Syringa Girls State program, including Flag Raising and Flag Retreat. Marching to and from the Flag Ceremonies shall be performed in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 6. Every citizen will pay proper respect to the Flag.
- 7. Girls State materials shall be taken to all sessions.
- 8. Prayers and Grace are offered on a voluntary basis. Each citizen shall be respectful to those who choose to offer Prayer and Grace.
- 9. Each citizen shall write a letter of appreciation to her sponsoring Unit and Contributors.
- 10. Each citizen must report any illness or injury to her counselor immediately.
- 11. Proper respect and courtesy shall be shown at all times to the special guests of Girls State, Girls State Director, Counselors and Staff.
- 12. Cell phones may be used as cameras during the day. Texting, calling and charging are only allowed at night after all activities are completed. Cell phones may be confiscated if these rules are broken.
- 13. Syringa Girls State delegates are encouraged to make uplifting, positive posts to their personal social media sites, including Facebook, Blogs, Twitter and Instagram. No posting of inappropriate, derogatory or abusive language should be posted on any social media website regarding staff members, fellow citizens, or Girls State activities.
- 14. Absolutely **NO ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, ILLEGAL DRUG OR NON-AUTHORIZED PRESCRIPTION DRUG** use is permitted or allowed.
- 15. Absolutely no boys are allowed in the dorms at any time.
- 16. Absolutely no harassment of any kind: sexual, sexual orientation, race or religion will be tolerated.
- 17. Every citizen will carry a photo ID at all times.
- 18. Violation of any rule of the American Legion Auxiliary Idaho Syringa Girls State Program and/or Northwest Nazarene University will result in discipline of the offending citizen up to and including immediate expulsion at the sole discretion of the Girls State Director. If any citizen is sent home, she will be responsible for the expense.

American Legion Auxiliary Idaho Syringa Girls State Daily Professional Attire Requirements for everyone who attends Girls State.

*There are rules governing professional attire on America's House and Senate floors. Men must be in a suit and tie. Women's dresses must be knee-length and cover the shoulders and cleavage. Suit jackets or sweaters must be worn with slacks. One of the highlights of Girls State is to match the professional attire of the numerous civic leaders we meet and learn about throughout the week. Your professional appearance, as a citizen of Girls State, reflects your dedication and appreciation for the other Girls State citizens, yourself, volunteer staff, and the political leaders you will represent.

EXPECTED PROFESSIONAL ATTIRE FOR ALL THOSE ATTENDING GIRLS STATE

- 1. Knee-length skirts or dresses with sleeves that cover shoulders and no cleavage showing
- 2. Dress pants (no jeans, khakis or shorts)
- 3. Dress tops with sleeves that cover shoulders, no cleavage showing and not see-through
- 4. Business footwear (must wear closed toe shoes for safety on capitol day)
- 5. Casual attire is untorn jeans/slacks with a modest t-shirt/blouse with full cover of shoulders and midriff

SUNDAY

- *Travel Time to Girls State-Please wear comfortable clothing. You will have time to change before we begin.
- *Opening Ceremonies-Knee-length dresses or skirts with tops (see above)
- *City Meetings-Casual attire (see above)
- *No shorts at City Meetings Sunday night please as we will be meeting together again for the Evening Assembly.

MONDAY

*All day- Dresses or skirts (knee-length) or dress pants with tops (see above)

TUESDAY

- *All day- Dresses or skirts (knee-length) or dress pants and tops (see above)
- *Recreation Night- Casual attire (see above)

WEDNESDAY

*All day- Dresses or skirts (knee-length) or dress pants and tops (see above)

THURSDAY

- *Capitol Day- Professional knee-length dresses or skirts (see above)
- *Must wear closed toe shoes (No heels or flip flops) for safety concerns
- *Talent Night- Casual attire (see above)

FRIDAY

- *All day- Dresses or skirts (knee-length) or dress pants and tops (see above)
- *Inauguration- Sunday dress or formal/prom dress

REMINDERS

- *There are only three times you must wear a dress or skirt during the week as listed above.
- *Wear comfortable shoes because we do LOTS of walking! High heeled shoes are not prohibited (except on Capitol Day), but not recommended, trust us. Flip flops are only to be worn during casual attire times.
- *Girls who decline to adhere to the above dress code, as signed and agreed to by all citizens and their parent/guardian, may be sent home at their parent's/guardian's expense or not allowed to participate in the Girls State activities.


